### What is the Foundation Center?

The Foundation Center is a national non-profit organization dedicated to promoting philanthropy by providing resources to connect nonprofit organizations with the grantmakers supporting them.

The Foundation Center aims to provide these resources to the nonprofit sector through its national network of more than 450 Funding Information Network collections. The Martin County Library System is part of this network.

### What resources are available?

**Databases:** (only available from within the Blake Library)

***Foundation Directory Online Professional*** - The most important resource for grant seekers we have at the library is the Foundation Directory Online Professional database. This resource provides access to detailed information on over 140,000 grant makers as well as separate databases on companies, grants, and grant recipients. This database is available in the Blake Library only and can be accessed any time the library is open.

***Foundation Grants to Individuals Online*** - Foundation Grants to Individuals Online is an online database of nearly 10,000 foundation and public charity programs that fund students, artists, researchers, and other individual grant seekers.

***Foundation Maps*** - A graphical version of Foundation Directory Online displaying maps showing the locations of foundations and grant recipients.
