Re: CSCMC Program and Funding Policies – Proposed Revisions

Attached are proposed revisions to the CSCMC Program and Funding Policies document based on CSCMC staff discussions with Program Committee members, as well as with legal counsel. One version of this document includes proposed language additions indicated with blue text and language deletions indicated with red strikethrough text. The second version has the revision markings removed for ease of reading. Some policies have been modified for clarification of intent and to coincide with current practices. Policies with more significant content changes are outlined below. (Policy number references follow the proposed re-numbered policies.)

Section 3. Funding Priority Areas - Funding Priority Area descriptions from the previous CSCMC Strategic Plan (2014-2019) are removed. Since a new Strategic Plan for 2021-2026 is in place, CSCMC staff prefers that Applicants benefit from reviewing the full Strategic Plan that is available via a link within the CSCMC Application for funding, as well as on the CSCMC website.

Policy 4.2 Developmental Funding – Developmental Funding is proposed to serve the same function as what was "Partnership Funding" for newly funded programs that need the benefit of 3-5 years of developmental time before being eligible for CSCMC's full annual cycle funding. The maximum funding dollars per program is increased from \$25,000 to \$35,000.

Policy 4.3 Partnership Funding – Partnership Funding is repurposed to apply to programs that are not developmental in nature but still fit within CSCMC's Strategic Plan. The funding per program does not exceed \$20,000 and will include an annual re-verification process with appropriate requirements.

Policy 4.6 Capacity-Building Funding -This proposed funding enables CSCMC to provide funds for improving other functions of Providers with CSCMC-funded programs such as financial management, human resources, strategic planning, governance, and information technology. CSCMC staff believes that by strengthening these functions, the quality of program services will be improved.

Policy 5.5 Background Screening - The background screening affidavit that is completed by funded Providers is expanded to include subcontractors of a CSCMC-funded program that are not directly funded by CSCMC.

Policy 5.6 Insurance – New requirement is added for funded Providers who utilize a leased or owned vehicle in the provision of services of a CSCMC-funded program to list CSCMC as an Additional Insured on their Automobile Liability insurance policy. New requirement is added for Providers' employees and subcontractors utilizing their personal owned or leased vehicle for the provision of services of a CSCMCfunded program to show proof of Automobile Liability insurance.

Policy 5.10 Notification Policies / 5.10a Critical Events or Circumstances – Language is added or revised to expand the Providers' requirements for notifying CSCMC of any events or circumstances that have the potential to negatively impact CSCMC or the Provider.

Staff Recommendation: Approve the proposed revisions to the CSCMC Program and Funding Policies document.

Grant Contract Extensions
